Policy & Government Affairs Update

As the 2013 legislative sessions have commenced, NECEC has been extremely active throughout the region, advocating and testifying at hearings in support of clean energy policies, and promoting industry growth.

State by State

Connecticut

Are you part of the earlystage cleantech innovation economy? NECEC's inaugural **Connecticut Clean Energy Day** was held on January 24th at the Connecticut State Capitol. NECEC Sponsor Brown Rudnick LLP hosted a luncheon for participants.

NECEC submitted **comments to the draft Comprehensive Energy Strategy** in December. The Strategy was released last fall by Governor Malloy's office and the Department of Energy & Environmental Protection (DEEP).

On March 19th, NECEC testified at hearings for two bills, **An Act Concerning Energy Efficiency Programs** (providing funding for oil heat efficiency programs) and **An Act Concerning Connecticut's Clean Energy Goals** (providing for long-term contracting and modifying Class I RPS eligibility).

Maine

The first **Maine Clean Energy Day** was held on March 21st. NECEC co-sponsored a legislative forum with E2Tech and the Maine State Chamber of Commerce in the morning, held meetings with legislators in the afternoon and hosted a reception sponsored by NECEC Sponsor Conservation Services Group.

Massachusetts

In March, NECEC submitted comments to the Department of Environmental Protection and **wrote a letter published in the Boston Globe** in support of demonstration of advanced waste to energy technologies.

NECEC is currently serving on the Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities' Grid Modernization Steering Committee to provide expertise on best practices for the adoption of grid modernization technologies and practices.

Our 2nd Annual **Massachusetts Clean Energy Day** will be held on May 9th. NECEC members interested in an exciting opportunity to showcase at the State House should **contact Scott Szycher** for more information.

New Hampshire

NECEC **testified at a hearing** to defend the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) in February, and **sent a letter thanking Governor Hassan** for her leadership in supporting RGGI. On March 20th, the House approved the RGGI cap reduction, and the bill now crosses over to the Senate side for consideration.

We applaud the NH Senate for defeating a wind moratorium bill, SB 99, on March 28th. This will allow progress in this critical sector in NH, allowing wind energy companies to grow, create jobs and help meet NH's RPS requirements.

Rhode Island

In February 2013, NECEC submitted comments on the Distributed Generation Long Term Contracts Program, and testified to the House Committee on Environment and Natural Resources on March 26th. NECEC gave the same testimony to the Senate Environment and Agriculture Committee on March 27th.

Our first Rhode Island Clean Energy Day will be held on April 25th.

Vermont

On February 26th, the Vermont Senate Natural Resources and Energy Committee defeated a three-year moratorium on wind project developments with a production capacity greater than 500 kilowatts. This decision marks an important step in ensuring that Vermont will continue to advance its growing clean energy economy.

Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI)

The Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative has been updated and advanced. On February 7th, the Governors of each New England state agreed to**update RGGI and lower the emissions cap** for all participating states to 91 million tons. Legislative approval for this change is required for only New Hampshire and Maine. NECEC is working actively in both states towards approval of the RGGI emissions cap reduction.

Federal Policy - December DC Fly-In

In December 2012, NECEC, several of its regional counterparts including other regional partners of the Advanced Energy Economy (AEE) network - and over twenty executives convened in Washington DC to advocate for clean energy issues in the lame-duck session and during the next Congress. **Read more about the December Fly-In**.

In December 2012, with the support and collaboration of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Cleantech Innovations New England**announced a needs driven competition** to grant service awards of up to \$130,000 to supplement the Massachusetts Clean Energy Center's (MassCEC) \$1M InnovateMass demonstration challenge. These supplemental awards will support companies delivering technologies that offer long-term, resilient, and commercially viable solutions to address nutrient pollution caused by insufficient wastewater treatment in coastal areas.
